Guest Speakers

BRUISER FLINT — James "Bruiser" Flint completed his 10th season as the head coach at Drexel University in 2010-11. Flint has established Drexel as one of the top programs in the CAA since arriving on the University City campus in 2001. The Philadelphia native was named the CAA Coach of the Year in 2009 for the third time, making him just one of two coaches in league history to win the award on three occasions. He was also named the District 10 Regional Coach of the Year by the NABC. Flint led the 2010-11 Dragons to the quarter-finals of the CAA tournament and finished with a 21-10 record.

PHIL MARTELLI - In 16 seasons as Saint Joseph's University head coach, Phil Martelli has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, is a perennial post-season participant and is a key player on the national scene.. His 16-year career mark stands at 300-209, and he is nine victories away from tying the SJU record held by Bill Ferguson. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories six times in 16 seasons. In 2010-11, Martelli reached two milestones with his 300th career victory (March 11) and his 150th conference win (March 5), while coaching his 500th game and 250th A-10 contest.

SPEEDY MORRIS - Morris spent 15 seasons as the head men's basketball coach at LaSalle University (1986-01), compiling a school-record 238 wins. His teams reached the postseason six times, includ-

ing four NCAA appearances, and won four MAAC Championships. The Philadelphia native, who has served as the head boys' basketball coach at St. Joseph's Prep since 2001, has also served as a high school coach at Roman Catholic (1968-81) and Penn Charter (1981-85). He is the winnigest coach in Philadelphia Catholic League history. Morris is a member of the La Salle Hall of Athletes, the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame, and will be inducted into the Philadelphia Sports Hall of Fame this fall.

JAY WRIGHT - Since the start of the 2004-05 campaign, Jay Wright's Villanova basketball team is 172-65 (.726). In that stretch, Wright led the program to seven consecutive 20-win seasons for the first time in program history. The `Cats are 78-42 (.650) in BIG EAST regular season action in that span and are one of only two BIG EAST programs that have appeared in each of the last seven NCAA Tournaments. Wright owns a lifetime record of 346-196 (.638) in 17 seasons as a head coach, including seven years at Hofstra and ten seasons at Villanova. He is 224-101 (.689) as head coach of the Wildcats, averaging 22.4 wins per season. Wright has earned Philadelphia Big Five Eastern College Coach of the Year and BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors.
